LCTA GOALS

- 4. Represent mountain biking interests in public forums and to recreation land managers, advocating equitable trail access.
- 5. Build new trails and assist in the maintenance of existing trails with the permission of the local land manager.
- 6. Provide high quality and diverse riding opportunities for the mountain biking community.
- 7. Develop appropriate riding opportunities near communities to increase accessibility.
- 8. Provide information relevant to mountain biking, e.g. about available trails, to cyclists.
- 9. Create active, engaged communities of riders statewide who are willing to donate, volunteer and support LCTA's mission on the ground.
- 10. To develop a broad and sustainable funding model that ensures the long-term viability of the organization.

LCTA BOARD MEMBER ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Board Members must be:

- Committed to the mission and vision of LCTA
- Active in the mountain bike community
- Willing to dedicate time, ensure mission advancement and serve as an ambassador within the community to deepen LCTA's relationships with land managers, financial and industry partners, members, and supporters.

Board Members commit to spending approximately 8-12 hours a month on average:

- Attending bi-monthly board meetings and any special meetings called during the year. Meetings are the 4th Monday of odd months. They can be attended in person in the CDA area or via conference call.
- Serving on at least one Committee (see requirements for Committees).
- Preparing board and committee work products outside of meetings.
- · Developing relationships with key donors or sponsors.
- Represent LCTA at events and activities outside of our Board Meetings as a volunteer or to experience what LCTA
 has to offer in order to make the best decisions for the organization (i.e.; trail building, education program, summer
 camps, events, and races).

Board Members also commit to:

- Serve a 2 year term, which can be renewed by a vote of the board at the annual meeting in September of each year. If a board member choses to resign; they must provide written notice of resignation with a minimum of 1 month advance notice.
- Represent the mountain bike community in a professional manner.
 Hold sensitive information in confidence.
 Avoid any real or apparent conflict of interest.
- Maintain active membership with LCTA.
- Keep current on policies, activities and trends affecting LCTA's mission.
- Contribute a personally significant financial donation to the organization on an annual basis.



Application Process:

If you think you have what it takes and can meet the Board commitment and tenure requirements, please fill out the Board Application below and include any relevant information that may assist us in evaluating your ability to have a positive impact on LCTA's Board of Directors and its ability to successfully achieve its mission and goals. We will be reviewing applications on a rolling basis, but you can anticipate an initial response from us within a month of receiving your application. All eligible applicants will meet with the Board Development Committee to discuss their qualifications and interest in serving on the Board of Directors.

Introductory Period:

If you are selected as a potential board member, you will be asked to serve for three months on a committee and to attend board meetings in an unofficial capacity. At the end of the three months, the board will vote on your official membership, and then your term will begin.
